- Read your textbooks carefully. They will help you develop the skills that you need to be a successful student
- Your assessment tasks will be marked by your tutor. The graded assessment tasks with comments will be sent back to you. During this time, you will be working on your next assessment task, continuing the study cycle
- Submit your assessment tasks for marking by the dates prescribed by the College
- Feel free to contact INTEC's Call Centre (0860 31 31 31) should you require any assistance, or have any questions for a tutor. Tutors are there to give you valuable feedback in order to help you improve your results
- Be sure to register for your examinations before the registration closing date

Making the right choices

National Senior Certificate

The National Senior Certificate (NSC) is a 3 year programme that consists of Grade 10, 11 and 12. This means that each grade has to be completed and passed separately. A National Senior Certificate will be awarded to you after successful completion of the National Senior Certificate Grade 12 examinations. The final examinations in Grade 12 will be administered by the Department of Basic Education (DBE). The National Senior Certificate is awarded by Umalusi. **(The National Senior Certificate is the minimum requirement for entrance to higher education).**

The National Senior Certificate curriculum is designed for learners residing in South Africa. All face-to-face assessments will **ONLY** be conducted in South Africa by designated NSC educators in their subject of expertise.



National Senior Certificate Grade 10 CAPS

Start your High School experience with INTEC College by enrolling for Grade 10. This course has been designed to give you the requisite knowledge needed to enter Grade 11.

Entrance Requirements

You must have a certified, official Grade 9 school report that indicates promotion to Grade 10, or a General Education and Training Certificate (GETC) for Adult Basic Education and Training (ABET), or NQF Level 1 Certificate, or recognised equivalent qualification obtained at NQF Level 1.

Course Duration

The academic year ends **31 December 2015**.

Learners are required to complete ALL their assessments within a calendar year. This means that you will start your studies in January/February and write your final examinations in October/November.

Should you enrol **AFTER 24 January 2015**, you may not sit for the examinations, write controlled tests or submit assessment tasks in the same year. You may, however, continue working through the study material, but ALL assessments may only be done in 2016 - the year in which you will write your final examinations.

Subject Selection Process

Your subject selection for Grade 10, 11 and 12 has to be the same. It is therefore important for you to give careful consideration to your subject choice in Grade 10. Make sure that you choose the subjects that you will need for the career that you want to pursue beyond Grade 12.

Subject Selection

Subjects are available in English only.

- Two languages from Group A must be chosen, one of which must be a home language. See page 25 and 26 for the subjects in each group
- Mathematics OR mathematical literacy AND life orientation are compulsory
- Mathematical literacy may not be chosen with physical sciences or agricultural sciences
- Mathematics must be chosen with physical sciences
- We strongly recommend that you choose mathematics with accounting

Turn to page 25 and 26 for possible career paths and to choose your subjects accordingly. If you need assistance, do not hesitate to contact a student consultant.

School Based Assessment (SBA)

- School Based Assessment (SBA) is assessment that takes place throughout the year. It consists of various types of assessment tasks such as research projects, controlled tests, investigation tasks, written reports and so forth
- All assessments for Grade 10 will be internally conducted by INTEC College
- You will be provided with a study schedule (which can be found in your study guide) AND an assessment timetable, which will be in the enrolment pack that you will receive after enrolment. The assessment timetable will also be available on the college website
- If you enrol in the year preceding the start of your academic year, you must contact the college for a timetable that is applicable to the year in which you will be doing your assessments
- All School Based Assessment (SBA) tasks have to be completed and submitted for marking within the timeframes prescribed by the college
- The SBA mark contributes 25% towards your total mark and the final examination contributes 75% towards your total mark for each subject

Controlled Tests

- You must write controlled tests for all the subjects that you are studying. This will be in addition to the examinations that will also be written for each subject that you are studying
- Controlled tests are tests that take place under supervised examination conditions. It is a shorter version of an examination
- The dates for controlled tests will be in your enrolment pack that you will receive after enrolment. It will also be posted on the college website. These dates and times are subject to change. You must consult the college website (www.intec.edu.za) for the most up-to-date information
- The college will only provide controlled test venues in major centres in each province in South Africa
- Special arrangements cannot be made for learners who live on the outskirts of major centres
- All controlled tests and examinations for the subjects that you are studying must be written in the same year
- Controlled tests will NOT be in your study guide
- You will be provided with a study schedule, which can be found in your study guide

Life Orientation

- One of the tasks that you have to complete for life orientation, is a Physical Education Task (PET)
- This task comprises four sections. One section will be completed for each of the four terms
- You have to attend face-to-face contact sessions throughout the year, with a life orientation educator, for the evaluation of your PET. The marks obtained for your PET will form part of your SBA mark. Your study guide for life orientation will stipulate the number of compulsory contact sessions for each section of this task
- PET sessions will take place on Saturdays
- The dates on which assessments for the PET task will take place will be in the Orientation Guide that will be included with your enrolment pack. The college will inform you if there are any changes to these dates. You must also check the college website regularly for the latest information available
- It is important that you attend EVERY contact session. If you fail to attend a contact session, then you will receive a zero for that particular session. In addition to this, you will be liable for the costs incurred for the assessment
- Additional information for the completion of this task is available from the college

Oral Component for Languages

- You will be required to do assessments for the oral component of the languages that you are studying. These will be face-to-face contact sessions with qualified language educators
- The assessment for the oral component for the languages is a formal examination that is compulsory. It will form part of your SBA mark and part of your final examination mark
- The oral examinations are part of a formal examination session and therefore it is compulsory that you attend these. Should you not attend any of the oral examinations, you will fail the entire subject and will have to repeat the subject the following year
- The dates on which the oral examination will take place will be in the enrolment pack that you will receive after enrolment. These dates are subject to change. You must consult the college website (www.intec.edu.za) for the latest information available
- Venues will be in major centres in South Africa only. Special arrangements cannot be made for learners who live on the outskirts of major centres

Learner Evidence of Performance File/Portfolio

- The college as part of your studies will compile a portfolio for each subject on your behalf
- A portfolio for a particular subject will contain all the required school based assessment tasks/assignments that you have completed (and that have been marked by the college) for each subject
- **The college will keep your portfolio for each subject neatly filed in a safe place for the duration of your studies (and at least six months afterwards)**
- Your portfolio will be internally moderated by the college AND externally moderated by the Department of Basic Education (DBE)

Examinations

- The final examinations for Grade 10 contributes 75% towards your final mark for each subject. Your progress to Grade 11 is determined by the final examination mark for each subject, as well as the marks obtained for school based assessment tasks
- Your final examinations for Grade 10 will be internal examinations administered by INTEC College
- Upon FINAL acceptance of your enrolment with the college, you will automatically be registered for ALL assessment requirements for your subject/s
- The college will only provide examination venues in major centres in each province in South Africa. Special arrangements cannot be made for learners who live on the outskirts of major centres
- **Examination fees are excluded from your enrolment fees. Examination fees are R650 per subject and are subject to change. Examination fees are payable by 31 March 2015**
- You will be examined and assessed on prescribed literature for all languages that you select. Prescribed textbooks and additional study aids for all subjects are **NOT** included in the course. You will need to source and purchase prescribed literature textbooks and additional study aids from external suppliers or publishers

- Upon successful completion of Grade 10, you will be issued with a **progress report**
- Final examinations for Grade 10 will be conducted in October/November only

Minimum Pass Requirements

- You need to complete all the required assessments for seven subjects, four of which are compulsory subjects, and are called **fundamentals**. The other three subjects are called **electives**
- The fundamentals are: A home language, a first additional language, life orientation, mathematics OR mathematical literacy
- You need to obtain 40% for three subjects, one of which must be a home language. The other two can be any other two subjects
- You will be required to obtain 30% for three other subjects

In summary: You need to pass three subjects with 40% (of which one must be a home language) and three with 30%. Even though you need not meet the minimum pass requirement (30%) for the seventh subject, you **MUST** have completed all the school based assessment (SBA) requirements, including examinations for the seventh subject, in order to be considered for promotion to the next grade.

Learning Material

Prescribed textbooks and additional study aids for all subjects are not included in this course. Learners will have to source and purchase these from Kalahari.com and/or external suppliers and publishers. Learners can request the prescribed textbook list from the sales consultant.



National Senior Certificate Grade 11 CAPS

Grade 11 is an important stepping stone to obtaining the National Senior Certificate. It is designed to start your preparation for your final Grade 12 year.

Entrance Requirements

A certified, official Grade 10 National Senior Certificate report which indicates promotion to Grade 11

Course Duration

The academic year ends **31 December 2015**.

Learners are required to complete ALL their assessments within a calendar year. This means that you will start your studies in January/February, and write your final examinations in October/November.

Should you enrol AFTER 24 January 2015 you may not sit for the examinations, write controlled tests or submit assessment tasks in that same year. You may, however, continue working through the study material, but ALL assessments may only be done in 2016 - the year in which you will write your final examinations.

Subject Selection Process

Make sure that you select the same subjects that you selected in Grade 10 that you will need in Grade 12 for the career path that you want to pursue. Subjects have to be completed within an academic year.

Subject Selection

The SBA mark contributes 25% towards your total mark and the final examination contributes 75% towards your total mark.

- You will be provided with a study schedule, which can be found in your study guide, AND an assessment timetable, which will be in the enrolment pack that you will receive after enrolment. The assessment timetable will also be available on the college website
- If you enrol in the year preceding the start of your academic year, you must contact the college for a timetable that is applicable to the year in which you will be doing your assessments
- All SBA tasks have to be completed and submitted for marking within the time frames prescribed by the college
- The CASS mark contributes 25% towards your total mark and the final examination contributes 75% towards your total mark

Controlled Tests

- You must write your controlled tests and do other assessment tasks in the same year that you register to write the internal mock examination and final external examinations

Physical Science Practical Session

- Physical science Grade 12 learners will be required to complete a practical assessment task in a face-to-face (contact) session with a qualified educator. This session will be held on a Saturday
- The college will only provide venues for this assessment task in major centres in each province in South Africa
- Special arrangements cannot be made for learners who live on the outskirts of major centres

Oral Component for Languages

- The college will appoint a qualified Grade12 language educator who will conduct the assessment for the oral component of the languages that you have chosen to study
- The oral examinations are part of a formal examination session and therefore it is compulsory that you attend these
- Should you not be present on the day that your oral examinations take place, you will not have a complete mark for the subject and you will not be resulted for the subject. A zero mark for oral examination means that you will have to repeat the entire subject. When you fail a home language, you will have to repeat the home language the following year. In addition to this, you will be liable for costs incurred for this assessment
- The dates on which the oral examination will take place will be in the enrolment pack that you will receive after enrolment

- These dates are subject to change. You must consult the college website (www.intec.edu.za) for the latest information available

Examinations

- **Grade 12 learners** will write **2 full-scale examinations**: a final **external examination** administered by the Department of Basic Education (DBE), and an **internal mock examination** administered by the college
- **All examination fees are excluded from the enrolment fees**

External Examinations

- External Grade 12 examinations are conducted by the Department of Basic Education (DBE). You must be registered for these examinations by **20 February 2015** of the year in which you want to write the October/November final external examinations
- Visit the college website (www.intec.edu.za) for the registration process per province for the external examination with the DBE
- Even though the College is providing you with the necessary guidelines on external examination registration, it is your responsibility to register for the final external examinations with the Department of Basic Education or an external examination venue offering the NSC Grade 12 examinations, as indicated for your province

- You will have to contact the college to inform us of your venue at which you will be writing your final external examinations
- The examination fees for the final external examination will be determined by the examination venue at which you will write
- You will be examined on prescribed literature for all languages that you select. Prescribed textbooks and additional study aids for prescribed literature are NOT included in the course. You will have to source and purchase prescribed literature textbooks and additional study aids from external suppliers and publishers
- Umalusi will issue you with a National Senior Certificate after it has been determined that you meet the minimum pass requirements for the National Senior Certificate

Internal Examination

- You must write the internal mock examinations in the same year that you register to write the final external examinations
- If you do not register for the mock examinations, your SBA mark will be incomplete; and you will not be resultated
- The internal mock examinations are administered by INTEC College in **August/September**
- Upon FINAL acceptance of your enrolment with the college, you will automatically be registered for all assessments requirements for each subject
- Examination venues will be provided in major centres in each province in South Africa. Special arrangements cannot be made for learners who live on the outskirts of major centres
- **Examination fees are excluded from your enrolment fees. These examination fees are R650 per subject and are subject to change. Examination fees are payable by 31 March 2015**
- You will be examined and assessed on prescribed literature for all languages that you select. Prescribed textbooks and additional study aids for prescribed literature are NOT included in the course. - The college will issue you with a progress report for the mock examinations

NB: Registration with the college for internal examinations and registration with the Department of Basic Education for external national examinations are two SEPARATE processes.

National Senior Certificate Repeat Learners for Grade 12

Do you need credits in order to obtain your National Senior Certificate because you did not meet the minimum pass requirements in previous examination sittings?

Did you complete the School Based Assessment (SBA) component for all the subjects for which you have written the final external Grade 12 examinations?

You can enrol for the subjects that you wish to repeat without having to re-do the SBA component.

Minimum Pass Requirements

- You need to complete all the assessment requirements for seven subjects, four of which are compulsory subjects, and are called **fundamentals**. The other three subjects are called **electives**
- The Fundamentals are: A home language, a first additional language, life orientation, mathematics or mathematical literacy
- You need to obtain 40% for three subjects, one of which must be a home language. The other two can be any other two subjects
- You will be required to obtain 30% for three other subjects

In summary: You need to pass three subjects with 40% (of which one must be a home language) and three with 30%. Even though you need not meet the minimum pass requirement (30%) for the seventh subject, you **MUST** have completed all the School Based Assessment (SBA) requirements, including examinations for the seventh subject, in order to be considered for promotion to the next grade.

Learning Material

School Based Assessment

Your School Based Assessments (SBA) marks are valid for three years. This means, that you do not have to re-do the SBA component of the subjects that you need to repeat. You need to only rewrite the final external examinations for these subjects.

Entrance Requirements

An official Grade 12 Statement of Results confirming the results for the subjects for which you want to enrol.

Course Duration

The study period may range from 12 months to 24 months, depending on the number of subjects that you wish to repeat and when you wrote your last examinations. Please refer to School Based Assessment.

Subject Selection

Subjects are available in English only.

You may only select subjects that you have already studied in Grade 12 (for which you have an SBA mark), and for which you wrote the external final National Senior Certificate Grade 12 examinations.

Turn to page 25 and 26 for the subject list.

Learning Material

Prescribed textbooks and additional study aids for all subjects are not included in this course. Learners will have to source and purchase these from external suppliers and publishers. Learners can request the prescribed textbook list from the sales consultant.

Examinations

- If you wrote the National Senior Certificate examinations administered by the Department of Basic Education (DBE), you have to ensure that you register to rewrite the subjects for which you did not meet the pass requirements with your previous high school, or an examination centre for part-time NSC Grade 12 repeat candidates before **20 February 2015**, in order for you to write during the October/November final external National Senior Certificate Grade 12 examinations
- The examination fees for final external examinations will be determined by the examination venue or your previous high school at which you will write the external examinations
- You will be examined on prescribed literature for the language subjects that you need to repeat. Prescribed textbooks and additional study aids for prescribed literature are NOT included in the course. You will have to source and purchase prescribed literature textbooks and additional study aids from external suppliers/publishers. You also need to make sure that the prescribed books on which the examinations will be set have not changed since the last time you wrote the examinations for the language subjects that you are rewriting
- **Umalusi will issue you with the National Senior Certificate once you have met the minimum pass requirements. Turn to page 23 for the minimum higher education admission requirements**

Higher Certificate

The minimum admission requirement is a National Senior Certificate with a minimum of 30% in the language of learning and teaching of the higher education institution at which you wish to pursue your studies.

The higher education institution may have requirements, **in addition** to the minimum requirements for the National Senior Certificate, that you may have to fulfil for the field of study that you wish to pursue. You may have to have a certain combination of recognised NSC subjects, and levels of achievement in those subjects, as determined by the higher education institution of your choice, before being considered for further studies at a higher education institution.

Diploma

The minimum admission requirement is a National Senior Certificate with a minimum of 30% in the language of learning and teaching of the higher education institution at which you wish to pursue your studies. This must be coupled with an achievement rating of 3 (Moderate Achievement, 40-49%) or better, in four recognised NSC 20 credit subjects.

NB: One of the minimum requirements for obtaining a National Senior Certificate is a minimum achievement rating of 3 (Moderate Achievement, 40-49%) in a home language.

The higher education institution may have requirements, **in addition** to the minimum requirements for the National Senior Certificate, that you may have to fulfil for the field of study that you wish to pursue. You may have to have a certain combination of recognised NSC subjects, and levels of achievement in those subjects, as determined by the higher education institution of your choice, before being considered for further studies at a higher education institution.



Bachelor's Degree

The minimum admission requirement is a National Senior Certificate with a minimum of 30% in the language of learning and teaching of the higher education institution at which you wish to pursue your studies. This must be coupled with an achievement rating of 4 (Adequate Achievement, 50-59%) or better, in four subjects chosen from the recognised 20 credit NSC subject designated list below.

The higher education institution may have requirements, **in addition to** the minimum requirements for the National Senior Certificate, which you may have to fulfil for the field of study that you wish to pursue. You may have to have a certain combination of recognised NSC subjects, and levels of achievement in those subjects, as determined by the higher education institution of your choice, before being considered for further studies at a higher education institution.
